in consideration of the sum of Ten Thousand of good & law-
ful money for our use paid to our Receiver General of our
Revenues in this our Colony and Dominion of Virginia
We have given granted and confirmed and by these presents
for us our Heirs and Successors Do give grant and confirm
unto Thomas Jefferson one certain Tract or Parcel of Land
containing two thousand Acres lying and being in the
County of Albemarle on the south side of the Rappahannock
River and on the branches of Blackwater and Judith's
Creeks and bounded as followeth, to wit, Beginning
at Mr. Nicholas Davis's corner by Judith's Creek on the
South side at several points and running thence
on the said Davis's line South seventy Degrees Next
three hundred and thirty six poles crossing a branch
several times to pointers South fifty five degrees
Next one hundred and forty poles to a Chestnut oak
thence on the line of Captain Thomas Ballou
South twenty four and an half degrees Next sixteen
poles to a red oak South eight degrees Next four hundred
and eight poles to pointers thence on Thomas's line
East two hundred and sixty five poles to a red oak
North forty five degrees East two hundred and forty
six poles crossing Three Creeks to a red oak South twenty
five degrees East seventy poles to pointers South fifty
degrees East sixty poles to pointers East eighty poles
to pointers North sixty two poles to pointers North
thirty five degrees East one hundred and six poles
to pointers North three hundred and sixty two poles to
a red oak sapling North sixty degrees Next twenty eight

granted and confirmed and by these presents give our
Heirs and Successors We do give grant and confirm unto Thomas
Jefferson one certain tract or parcel of land containing five
hundred and six acres lying and being in the County
of Albemarle on the South side of the Rappahannock and near
the Blue ridge and bounded as followeth, to wit, Beginning
at a hickory corner to John Dawson and Thomas Cuspin &
running on the said Cuspin's line South sixty degrees East
three hundred and eight poles to a white oak caplin
thence on Thomas Meriwether's line South sixteen
degrees West two hundred and thirty six poles to point
thence on Thomas Calloin's line North sixty five degrees
West four hundred and seventy poles to a black oak then
new lines North sixty degrees East one hundred and sixty
six poles to a Beech and North forty degrees East one
hundred and twenty four poles to the beginning. With
