Dear sister

Mrs Pine set off this morning to England

I staid with her till a day or two before she went and am
now with papa and hope to be for some time I expect
to go then to mrs Brodeau. I have heard that she is a
very agreeable woman ~~and that~~ all her scholars are very
fond of her. Papa intends to go to bethlehem a place 50
miles off to see it. I shall also go with him but we shall
not be longer away than a week. Will you tell
me ^{which} game that I have not seen dear anna's hair ~~that~~ she

said I she had sent me to see how much it had grown
but I should thank you for some of it
adieu Dear sister believe me to be yours most sincerely
