thence on Burks line North thirty degrees East two hundred and
thirty two poles crossing a branch to pointers near a small branch
thence a new line North seventy two degrees West three hundred and
sixty four poles crossing a small branch and the said Creek
to pointers in Nicholas Davis's line thence on Davis's line
South forty two degrees West seventy three poles to pointers in the
said Davis's line thence new lines South fifty five degrees East
forty poles crossing a branch to a maple South thirty five degrees
East seventy one poles to pointers South fifty degrees East fifty
three poles to a Charnut Oak saplin South forty six poles to
pointers South twenty seven and an half degrees East sixty
