some other individual to act for me

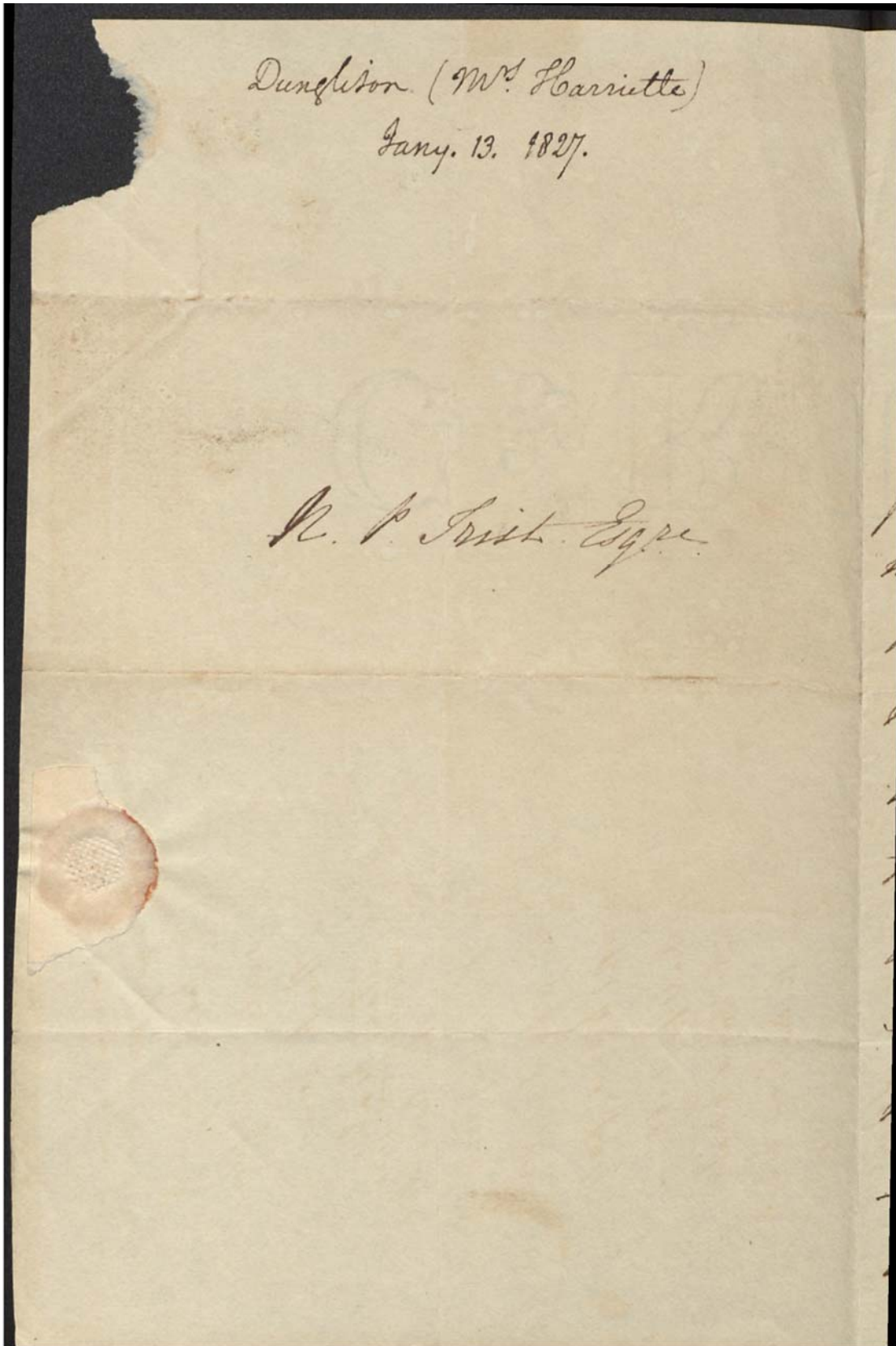
Apologizing, Sir, for the trouble
